#### Assessment and Evaluation

Teachers will continue to assign learning tasks and culminating activities and provide feedback; however, this work will only be taken into consideration for Semester 1 final marks if it improves the student's mark. If not, final marks submitted for Semester 1 will reflect work completed by December 17, 2021. This means that a student's mark will not drop as a result of end of semester evaluations.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

Students who are physically present in class or who are actively engaged with the teacher electronically during the class period will be marked present (or late, if appropriate) by the teacher. Students who are working asynchronously, or who are not actively participating in class will be marked as absent by the teacher. We are asking that students respect the scheduled hours of class time and if they attend class they expect to be in class for the entire period.

If your child is going to be absent/late, please report by 9 am by calling the school and follow the prompts to leave a message on the attendance line. Please do not send an email to the general school mailbox as it is not meant for daily attendance reporting and may be missed.

## **CREDIT RESCUE**

Credit Rescue will continue at the end of this semester to support students whose credit(s) are in risk. Credit Rescue Days are January 28, January 31, and Feb 1. All students must attend in-person or virtually for attendance to be taken on these days. Teachers will communicate with students/parents/caregivers who should access credit rescue opportunities as well as the expectations for students who do not require credit rescue support at this time.

### HEALTH AND SAFETY PROTOCOLS

We will continue to be diligent regarding all health and safety protocols for in-school learning. All students and staff MUST wear an appropriate mask, properly covering their face at all times when in the building. This includes in class and travelling throughout the building.

Three ply masks will be available to students at school and were also distributed before we left for the break.

During the lunch period, students can temporarily remove their masks while actively eating or drinking but are asked to replace the mask as soon as they are finished. It is important that while students are eating that they maintain social distancing. It is important that students do their part to maintain social distancing protocols especially while eating and drinking. They are encouraged to go outside or home for lunch, where able and appropriate.

Classrooms, where possible, will have the windows open for improved ventilation. All classrooms are also equipped with HEPA units

COVID PCR TESTING: MGH will continue to support and accept the take-home COVID-19
PCR test kits for schools in East Toronto. These kits will be prioritized for symptomatic
students and education staff attending in person learning.

Symptomatic students and education staff who meet <u>testing eligibility</u> can pick kits up from your school and also pick up and drop off take-home COVID-19 PCR test kits at our <u>MGH COVID-19 Assessment</u> <u>Centre</u> or <u>COVID-19 Outreach Centres</u>. You do not need an appointment to pick up or drop off a take-home test kit.

- RAPID ANTIGEN TESTING: Please report positive results on a rapid antigen test to a secure reporting page at Microsoft Forms. The Michael Garron Hospital Infectious Diseases team will be notified of your result and will do our best to contact you to help to ensure you have the information you need to manage the infection and prevent further spread.
- COVID VACCINATION: MGH continues to offer first, second and/or third doses at both our school based clinics and also our MGH vaccine clinics.


#### Mobile WALK-IN COVID Vaccination school clinics across East Toronto will also offer:

- **First and second dose:** Open to individuals aged 5 and older who live and/or go to school in any postal code. At This time Children need to have had their 5<sup>th</sup> birthday to be eligible. Children aged 5-11 can get their second dose 21 days after the first dose with informed consent from their parent/guardian.
- Third (booster) dose eligibility: Open to individuals aged 18+ who live and/or go to school in a priority postal code designated for that clinic.
- Walk-ins welcome from eligible individuals while supply lasts. Either Pfizer or Moderna will be administered.

# Pop-Up Vaccine Clinics in East Toronto





#### First and second dose eligibility:

- Open to individuals aged 5+ who live and/or go to school in any postal
- <u>code.</u> Children must be at least 5 years old at the time of vaccination. Children aged 5-11 can get their second dose 21 days after the first dose with informed consent from their parent/guardian.

#### Third (booster) dose eligibility:

Open to individuals aged 18+ who <u>live and/or go to school in a **priority postal code** designated for that clinic. Please see priority postal codes for each clinic below. Individuals must be at least 18 years old at the time of</u> vaccination.

- Walk-ins welcome from eligible individuals. No appointments needed.
- · Pfizer or Moderna will be administered.

Health card not required if you do not have one. You can bring an ID or document with your name, like a driver's license, passport, utility bill, pay stub, student ID or report card. Even if you do not have these documents, we encourage you to attend one of these clinics. Our team will do their best to help get you vaccinated. Physicians and nurses are available to answer your questions about the vaccine.
